Key Questions to consider when reviewing the draft Scoping Assessment	Submitted Feedback
Is there any additional information that should be considered as part of the Scoping Assessment?	Yes. Contractors like Greenside Electric need to be included for an assessment of need to encourage property owners to install solar on private rooftops/vacant land; government engagement needs to be assessed for funding to help property owners install power walls and feed back into the grid.
Do the areas identified as requiring further study through a regional planning approach resonate based on local developments?	Areas like Gravenhurst/ Muskoka are prime for encouraging private renewables and conservation. Lots of new high-end building means high standards can be set for net zero housing. IESO needs not just to assess the areas, but their residents' capacities to contribute to energy savings.



Are there other areas or specific considerations	Getting into the 21st century means not just
that should be examined through regional	responding to demand anymore, but using
planning?	proactive means to CUT demand. The sponsors
