Subject:	Southern Huron-Perth Long-term Electricity Plan Posted

The long-term electricity plan – Integrated Regional Resource Plan (IRRP) – for the Southern Huron-Perth area that considers electricity demand and supply conditions over the next 20 years is now <u>available</u>.

The IRRP identifies that the capability of the existing electricity infrastructure is approaching its limits, however no imminent needs are expected due to steady local growth. Since any marginal changes in growth could significantly delay or advance needs, the IRRP also examined a high growth scenario and potential solutions. Key recommendations in the IRRP include:

- In the near-term, continue to observe local growth and consider targeted non-wires solutions in the area to further defer future needs; and,
- In the long-term and/or in the event needs are accelerated, pursue targeted Conservation and Demand Management (CDM)\* and wires solutions (load transfer).
