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

Stakeholder Engagement Framework – Current Status



- New framework launched in May with engagement days, meeting two of the four goals of the new framework – greater certainty and addressing stakeholder fatigue
- Initial feedback from stakeholders has been positive

The two remaining objectives to fulfill with the new framework:

- Supporting an understanding of linkages between initiatives
- Supporting a foundation for more comprehensive and integrated updates



Engagement Framework – Next Steps

- Introduce new engagement categories to highlight the interconnectivity of the engagement initiatives and corporate strategy
- 2. Refocus the working group structures by streamlining existing groups and introducing a new advisory group that supports IESO efforts to advance sector and market changes by bringing together stakeholder interests and perspectives to facilitate efficient decision-making and the advancement of IESO activities



1. New Engagement Categories

- Four categories have been developed for the IESO's active engagements based on how stakeholders interact with the IESO
- Each of these engagement categories have a specific area of focus, but are linked together as a cycle to recognize how they all work together
- The new groupings and linkages will be introduced through an update to the IESO engagement main page and the active engagements webpage

2. Refocus Working Groups and Committees

Goals for refocusing the working groups and committees:

- provide broad cross-cutting view of engagement activities (eliminate silos)
- establish a group to help efficiently resolve entrenched issues or roadblocks
- support a deeper understanding of stakeholder priorities
- inform key IESO initiatives before they launch
- bring consistent nomenclature and structures to IESO engagement vehicles
- support more integrated updates and advice to the Stakeholder Advisory Committee



Refocus Working Groups and Committees - Next Steps

There are two next steps to refocusing IESO's working groups and committees:

- Introduce a new Stakeholder Planning and Priorities Advisory
 Group to support efforts to advance sector and market changes by bringing together stakeholder interests and perspectives to facilitate the advancement of IESO activities and efficient decision-making
- Streamline the number of IESO working/advisory groups and add consistency to the creation and operation of these groups



Introduce New Stakeholder Planning and Priorities Advisory Group

Objective:

Facilitate IESO efforts to advance sector and market changes by bringing together stakeholder interests and strategic perspectives to inform the advancement of IESO activities and efficient decision-making

Make-Up:

- Maximum of 10 members with a balanced representation
- Committee to be chaired by Director of Corporate Affairs, supported by director leads on key/initiatives identified for discussion in advance of meetings





Introduce New Stakeholder Planning and Priorities Advisory Group - Overview

The new advisory group will provide a forum for regular dialogue between IESO and stakeholders to:

- seek informed input to support IESO planning and prioritization of initiatives
- identify issues affecting customer segments and participants
- support the resolution of roadblocks holding back progress in IESO engagements/activities
- provide input on engagements prior to launch

- promote greater understanding of linkages between IESO engagements/activities
- act as a venue for the IESO to identify upcoming changes to documents/tools/ processes that lack pre-defined engagement structures (i.e. market manuals)
- discuss customer readiness for initiatives prior to implementation



Introduce New Stakeholder Planning and Priorities Advisory Group - Functionality

Functionality:

- meetings to take place on a quarterly basis, minimum
- regular committee reports/updates will be shared with Stakeholder Advisory Committee
- meetings are open to the public as observers, or when identified to speak by the Chair
- in-camera meetings could be utilized on limited basis before/after regular meetings
- time limited Technical Working Groups can be established for specific initiatives/issues
- members appointed by the Board of Directors



Roles and Responsibilities

Operational Committees (OC)

- Provides strategic- and policy-level advice to the IESO Board and Executive Team
- Identify and discuss emerging issues and external developments with view to understand impact/benefit to electricity sector
- Appointed representatives from all aspects of the sector


- Proposes/reviews amendments to the Market Rules
- Advises the Board on specific technical issues relating to the operation of the markets
 - Appointed representation from market participants

- Provides operationallevel advice to IESO management
- Informs prioritization and scoping of engagements from the perspective of the sector
- Can assist in addressing challenges that occur during active engagements
- Identifies issues affecting customer segments and participants

- Established for a limited duration to address specific issue in detail
- Initiated by IESO through the SPPAG
- Provide advice around operational subject areas (i.e. Reliability Standards, Revenue Metering)
- Help stakeholders to stay informed on key operational matters



Revised Engagement Structure



Operational Committees will continue to provide engagement focus on technical subject areas (i.e. Reliability Standards, Revenue Metering)



Streamline the IESO Working/Advisory Groups

Introduce consistency to the creation and operation of engagement groups and streamline existing ones:

- consolidate priorities from the Demand Response Working Group, Energy
 Storage Advisory Group, and Market Development Advisory Group to the new
 Stakeholder Planning and Priorities Advisory Group
- phase out the Regional Planning Review Advisory Group when the associated engagement ends
- close out the following inactive groups: Information and Technology Standing Committee, Inter-jurisdictional Trading Standing Committee, Market Information Working Group

Next Steps

- Pending feedback from SAC:
 - proceed to update website and materials to reflect the new categories for the November/December engagement days
 - implement the revised engagement structure in Q1 2021,
 streamlining the existing advisory/working groups, as outlined
