GEN-25 – Policy on electricity and gas legal units of measurement and functions used for billing

- Issued: 2016-02-01
- Effective: 2016-02-01

- Revision removes references to approval and verification of TOU functions.

- Impact to IAM: none

E-35 – Policy on the retention of metering information and legally relevant interval data used in billing applications

- Issued: 2016-03-01
- Effective: 2016-07-01

- 5 minute data retained by owner/contractor for minimum 2 calendar years;
- Cumulative legally relevant data shall be made readily accessible by owner/contractor for review;

E-35 – Policy on the retention of metering information and legally relevant interval data used in billing applications

- Cumulative legally relevant data for each billing period shall be kept by the owner/contractor for at least 12 months after the meter ceased to be used.
- Impact: Opportunity to align data retention policies.

E-28 – Qualification of electricity meters for lengthened initial reverification period of 10 years

- Issued: 2016-03-01
- Effective: 2016-03-01

- Impact: ION 8600 meter received unconditional 10-year initial reverification period for meters manufactured after April 18 2013

GEN-43 – Policy for electricity and gas measurement dispute investigations

- Issued: 2016-04-18
- Effective: 2016-04-18
- The purpose of this bulletin is to provide Measurement Canada's (MC) policy and requirements for conducting measurement dispute investigations pursuant to section 23 of the *Electricity and Gas Inspection Act*.
