Technical Panel Comments:

There were no comments at Technical Panel related to the proposed market rule amendments on the interests of consumers with respect to prices, reliability and quality of electricity service.

Stakeholder Comments:

The IESO received comment during the October 27, 2020 Public Information Session from the Association of Major Power Consumers in Ontario related to the proposed market rule amendments on the interests of consumers with respect to price. The stakeholder's question and IESO response can be found below:

• **Stakeholder Question:** In the rare case that actions taken to prevent endangering the safety of any person, equipment damage, or the violation of any applicable law

- (SEAL) arise during abnormal conditions on the grid and subject the dispatchable load to negative congestion management settlement credits (CMSC), would this proposed rule provide a mechanism for the dispatchable load to eliminate/reduce this exposure?
- **IESO Response:** All CMSC amounts, positive and negative, during SEAL conditions may be considered under the IESO process described in Chapter 9, Section 3.5.6E, which the proposed market rule amendment will be subject to. As well, market participants may inform the IESO if inappropriate CMSC amounts have been invoiced and the notice of disagreement process was not applicable by notifying IESO Customer Relations.
