Regional electricity planning continues to advance for the [Kitchener/Waterloo/Cambridge/Guelph](#) (KWCG) region to ensure a reliable supply of electricity and support local growth and economic development.

This region includes the City of Guelph, the Region of Waterloo including the municipalities of Kitchener, Waterloo, and Cambridge, and the townships of Wellesley, Woolwich, Wilmot, North Dumfries, as well the Townships of Mapleton, Centre Wellington, Puslinch, and Guelph/Eramosa in Wellington County, and the Township of Blandford-Blenheim in Oxford County.

A regional electricity plan – Integrated Regional Resource Plan (IRRP) – is under development, looking at the unique needs of the area, and will consider a range of options and resources to meet future needs.
