Do you have any comments regarding the impacts that agricultural land-use limitations may have on project development?	I'm glad to see this question finally being asked as it demonstrates that these RFP processes can and do evolve and mature. In Ontario, we have finite land resources available and growing competition for those lands to meet our housing, food, jobs, energy, recreation, and environmental needs. A thoughtful land use planning response is essential to attempting a balanced and sustainable approach whereby our farming and food system isn't unnecessarily and permanently disrupted for energy projects that could reasonably be sited on any of industrial, commercial or brownfield land. Could Rated Criteria Points be used to incentivize development on brownfield land? For E-LTI, Rated Criteria points were awarded to incentivize geographical locations in the province, would same work for brownfield?
Do you have any comments regarding what evaluation criteria can be utilized to evaluate project readiness, given tight timelines and reliability needs?
