General Comments/Feedback

- The City of Ottawa is encouraged to see that behind the meter is now being considered.
- In line with the Climate Emergency unanimously declared by the City of Ottawa, we recommend that only non-combustion related resources be considered. Although, combustion generation can in theory employ a carbon neutral or negative fuel, the amount of such fuels available is limited and our modeling indicated that there will be heavy demands upon them for building heating.
- The IESO's planning should consider a prospective level of attrition on projects and work this into their planning. As such, and in consideration of increasing demand, it may be prudent to run a quick procurement of some renewable resources, for example East and West of FETT.

- Co-ordination with LDC is encouraged so as to address both local system and bulk system needs.
- Ottawa is aware of resources which could potentially use a brownfield site and could help support a district energy system. Would there be consideration to awarding points for such secondary benefits (and perhaps others which might be identified by others)?
- As the City of Ottawa's Energy Evolution program requires that our community eventually be served with zero emission electricity, we request that the environmental attributes of resources not be traded away from the Ontario electricity system.
- Using ZOOM as the meeting platform would allow for meeting comments to be directed (exclusively) to a moderator.
