Topic	Feedback
What other information should be considered in the study scope and the examination of the potential options?	Options and costs of inter-connections between various community (45 or 115 KV ) lines and higher voltage (230 or 500) lines.
What feedback do you have regarding the study findings?	Informative on where line between Aroland and Little Jackfish will go. Would like to see a more structured process with Matawa and the IESO/MOE/etc. so we are all on the same page.
What additional information should be provided in future engagements to help share perspectives and insights?	Better maps – IESO maps are not total accurate. Our environment department had to revise the maps into more detailed accurate maps, i.e.: the waterpower sites on the Albany River are not in the right place, some communities are wrongly placed (i.e.: Nibinamik and Wannamin Lake).

### General Comments/Feedback

It is interesting to see how all the transmission plans are linked, i.e.: the area of Barrie to Sudbury and then on to Wawa is integral to N.W. Ontario. The inter-connects across and between Provinces have assumed greater importance. Some stuff is repeated but useful to know. I don't know how many session have been held in First Nation as this process is moving very quickly.
