Capacity Auction: Forward Guidance and Minimum Target Threshold

Stakeholders are invited to provide general feedback on the proposed approach for forward guidance and minimum target threshold	<p data-bbox="743 543 1515 852">On slide 31, the IESO lays out its plan for forward Capacity Auction guidance. At the time of AAR publication the IESO will provide a firm target for the next auction, and an “anticipated target within a range” for the following auction. Is the range set for that second auction binding, in that the IESO will be obligated to firm up its target in between that range when it publishes the subsequent AAR?</p> <p data-bbox="743 900 1498 1094">If yes, the IESO should not be bound by the maximum capacity need set in a previous AAR, as this may handcuff the IESO’s ability to address pressing capacity needs. A binding minimum remains prudent as it helps create a stable business environment and minimize invest risk.</p> <p data-bbox="743 1142 1507 1289">If no, how does the future guidance provided by a range differ from the IESO’s proposed guidance for more distant capacity auctions, which the IESO describes as “illustrative forward guidance?”</p>

General Comments / Feedback

On Slides 33 and 34 the IESO outlines its plans to add a minimum target capacity to future auctions. Can the IESO please clarify whether it intends to set a minimum target and allow for supply-demand dynamics to decide whether the auction clears more or less capacity than the target quantity. Alternatively, does the minimum represent a minimum procurement level, in that the IESO is committing to clear at least that much capacity in the auction?
