## Qualified Capacity Proposals

What questions or feedback do you have on the updated Qualified Capacity (QC) proposals?	Capital Power appreciates the IESO's position that both planning, and procurement processes should be aligned, and that because Effective Load Carrying Capacity ("ELCC") is not used in the IESO's planning processes, it should not be used for procurement. Capital Power suggests that if the barrier to considering ELCC for procurement purposes is lack of integration of ELCC in the planning process, then the IESO should more broadly consider whether ELCC is a more accurate measure of the capacity value of renewable resources and whether ELCC should be used in both planning and procurement processes.

Capital Power appreciates the IESO's ongoing efforts to engage stakeholders and seek feedback in response to various elements of the Resource Adequacy Framework. While the IESO presented its Annual Acquisition Report ("AAR") at the July 22 engagement meeting, Capital Power understands the IESO is not seeking feedback on the contents of the AAR at this time, and that future engagements will provide opportunities for stakeholders to provide feedback with respect to the proposed competitive mechanisms, procurement targets, and forecasts set out in the AAR. Stakeholder concerns and feedback relating to the AAR will be critical for ensuring future procurements and competitive processes attract both participants and needed investment in Ontario.
