| What questions or feedback do you have on the Medium-Term RFP proposed design consideration on Contract Design Considerations | Resources with existing contracts ending during the term of the first Mid-Term RFP should be allowed to honor their contracts until the end; their newly rewarded contracts under the Mid-Term RFP should only begin once the previous contracts have ended. Truncating contracts (i.e. early termination) to require resources to sell and deliver capacity from May 1st 2026 will result in higher capacity offer prices. Evolgen supports the bid structure in \$/MW-month and the seasonal UCAP values. However, we disagree strongly with the target of the first mid-term RFP to be "Up To" 750MW. The IESO should commit to procure 750MW in its entirety as announced. Procuring less UCAP based on considerations that are not previously defined is arbitrary, hurts transparency and market confidence. |
| What questions or feedback do you have on the Medium-Term RFP proposed design consideration on Performance Obligations | The sum of all types of performance charges should not exceed 100% of seasonal capacity revenues for a committed resource. |

| <p>What questions or feedback do you have on the Medium-Term RFP proposed design consideration on Rated Criteria</p> | <p>Evolugen disagrees with the concept of Rated Criteria, as it introduces value for other attributes of a product that is procured solely for its capacity. If the IESO has target capacity requirements by location or zones, it should publish such targets ahead of time, and signal the need to participants who can then adjust their offers accordingly. Dispatchability and duration-of-service are criteria that should be dealt with via performance clauses. Operating reserve should not be considered at all when procuring capacity products: if the IESO had a need for ancillary services, it should address this need independently from the capacity procurement process.</p> |
