IESO SAC Feedback: Improving Access to Data

- Main categories of the ETNO recommendations on Improving Access to Data were presented by the ETNO Chair and Vice-Chair
- ETNO informed SAC of the following questions/themes that are under consideration for the next sprint and were asked if they had any comments:
- Should LDCs be permitted to own and operate DERS?
- What other non-distribution uses should LDCs engage in?

IESO SAC Feedback: Improving Access to Data (Continued)

- What potential DER structures hold the most promise with respect to efficiency and consumer benefit? Will LDCs become system operators or load-serving entities?
- How would utility remuneration models need to change to respond?

IESO SAC Feedback: Improving Access to Data

Comments from SAC included the following:

From members representing Generators

Important to consider how potential DERs will be structured in terms of drivers, resiliency and cost effectiveness.

Consideration on how ETNO work fits with the Resource Adequacy Framework. It was noted that Ontario Power Generation is the only generator on ETNO list.

The Resource Adequacy Framework does not appear to include a category that deals with DERs.

LDCs should not be in the generation business. Provincial direction and policy guardrails may be required to address this matter.

Both large and small generators need to be represented.

IESO SAC Feedback ... continued

From members representing Energy Related Businesses and ServicesA

There appears to be overlap between OEB engagements and with IESO's white papers Parts 1 & 2. Third party providers are able to do things more cheaply; more references should be made to competition.

DERs owned by rate-based LDCs is an important topic that needs to be addressed soon.

From members representing Consumers

Consider how the IESO application for third-party data in 2021 fits with what ETNO and OEB are doing to ensure coordination and prioritization of the best interest of the consumer.

Question was asked whether consumers could opt out of having their information disclosed; consumers want choice and would need to provide consent to providing their information. They also shouldn't be excluded from the discussion.

ETNO's membership should include electricity customers (large and small).

There is potential of duplication of work between ETNO and the OEB.

Recommendations on Improving Access to Data - Update

Recommendations were circulated for additional feedback after comments on recommendation (1) green button, and (2) data from DERs, were incorporated after the first round of comments. Two additional comments were received from ETNO members specific to recommendation #2 (Develop policies to enforce standards for third parties accessing customer data) during this second round of soliciting feedback:

Comment received: Policies/guidelines need to be clearly defined.

The report was updated to reflect this recommendation.

Recommendations on Improving Access to Data – Update (continued)

Comment received: With regards to the recommendation in the report to create standards for data use, retention etc. by third parties to protect consumers, it was suggested that the report should not only view consumer protection from the perspective of the privacy of residential customers but should also consider the protection of data for larger commercial consumers where the protection of energy data could have proprietary and competitive implications.

Recommendations on Improving Access to Data – Update (continued)

 Large commercial entities generally have the legal resources required to protect their own data and likely do not require regulator/government involvement for this purpose. Keeping this recommendation focused on smaller, potentially vulnerable consumers is a way to limit the extent of regulatory burden that would be imposed on third parties by this recommendation and is consistent with the existing regulatory framework for consumer protection with regards to energy retailers.
