

LLT RFP Question and Comment Period

Questions and Comments

The following document summarizes IESO responses to the questions and comments submitted to the IESO in respect of the final LLT RFP documents posted on May 6, 2026, that were submitted pursuant to Section 3.2(a) of the Long Lead-Time Request for Proposals (LLT RFPs) prior to the Question and Comment Deadline.

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Defined Terms

Capitalized terms used but not defined in the IESO Responses in this document have the meanings given to them in the LLT(e) RFP or the LLT(c) RFP (each, an “LLT RFP”, and collectively, the “**LLT RFPs**”, and the LLT(e) Contract or the LLT(c) Contract (each an “LLT Contract”, and collectively, the “**LLT Contracts**”), as applicable. Italicized terms have the meaning given to them in the IESO Market Rules.

Question/Comment	IESO Response
1) Now that the LT2 (c-1) results have been released, when is the IESO aiming to provide the updated Pre-Deliverability Results?	The IESO intends to provide updated pre-deliverability test results for projects tested during the first submission window at the same time as results are provided for projects submitted into the second submission window. These results will incorporate the LT2 (c-1) RFP results and are targeted to be distributed by the end of July 2026. Where a potential Proponent has submitted more than three pre-deliverability test intake forms, results for any additional intake forms will be assessed on a best effort basis and are expected to be provided before the end of August. While the IESO will endeavour to process each pre-deliverability test intake form submitted, due to processing limitations it may not be able to do so in all cases. If any pre-deliverability test intake forms are not processed, the applicable Proponents will be notified as soon as possible.
2) If projects are cancelled because of unforeseen connection costs after bid award, will bid fees be returned and/or will penalties be imposed?	Per Section 3.7(b) of the LLT(c) RFP and the LLT(e) RFP, the Proposal Fee will be non-refundable, except in instances where the Proponent withdraws the Proposal prior to Proposal Submission Deadline. Per Section 3.8(a)(iv) of the LLT(c) RFP and LLT(e) RFP, should any Selected Proponent fail to execute and deliver the LLT Contract and all related closing documents required by the IESO within the required timeframes in respect of any Selected Proposals, such Selected Proponents will be in breach of the LLT RFP with respect to such Proposals and the IESO may, in its Discretion, disqualify such Selected Proposals, draw upon the Proposal Security, and/or disqualify any or all other Selected Proposals submitted by the same Selected Proponent. Following the execution of an LLT Contract, Supplier Events of Default and resulting remedies (including termination and drawing

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	upon the Completion and Performance Security) are outlined in Article 10 of the LLT(e) Contract or LLT(c) Contract, as applicable. Per Section 10.2(d)(i) of the LLT Contract, the limit of the Supplier's liability prior to the Commercial Operation date is the full amount of the Completion and Performance Security that was required to have been posted as of the termination date.
3) If related projects are interdependent (i.e. if one project site does not receive a contract it will kill the other projects that are interdependent) will IESO consider them as a single project?	Per Section 2.1(c)(i) of the LLT(c) RFP and the LLT(e) RFP, the IESO has defined an LLT Capacity Project and an LLT Energy Project as a Facility that delivers Electricity through its own meter. Accordingly, each project must be submitted as an individual Proposal and will be evaluated individually as outlined in Section 4 of the RFP. Projects must be submitted individually under a single Proposal and will not be linked or considered interdependent for the purposes of evaluation or when offering LLT Contracts to Selected Proponents.
4) Can projects be aggregated for the purposes of pre-deliverability testing?	Consistent with Proposal evaluation, each pre-deliverability test intake form (and project) will be considered individually. The IESO will not aggregate prospective projects for the purposes of pre-deliverability testing.
