**Subject:** Bulk transmission planning in East Ontario – Upcoming webinar

The IESO will host a public webinar on April 14, 2022 at 10 a.m. to provide an update and seek input on an electricity planning study within the defined Gatineau transmission corridor area. The study examines transmission equipment reaching end-of-life (EOL), assesses the scope of refurbishment for that equipment and looks at broader reliability needs in the area.

The Gatineau transmission corridor is 300 kilometres long and stretches between the Greater Toronto Area East and Ottawa and passes through Peterborough.

All interested parties are invited and encouraged to participate including, but not limited to, local municipalities, Indigenous communities, businesses, stakeholders and members of the general public.
