What additional information, if any, should be incorporated in the proposed scenarios?	I oversee Economic Development in Lennox and Addington County. Over the past three years we have had large manufacturing projects / investment inquiries for both Napanee and Loyalist Township. In all cases, an expansion of the electrical infrastructure was required to service the manufacturer. This results in substantial costs and time for the business. We are hoping that employment land availability / opportunities are considered in regional planning. While we have substantial industrial land available, the current electrical infrastructure does not support manufacturing or data centres.
