Please consider Ministerial Zoning Orders (MZOs) as they are released by the province. An MZO was recently issued by the province related to the redevelopment of Base 31 in Prince Edward County. The development is expected to accommodate about 10,000 people and businesses. An MZO is also expected in the coming months for the redevelopment of Picton Terminals.
