Subject: You're Invited - December 18, 2025 - IESO Webinar RE: Sudbury/Algoma Regional Electricity Planning

Regional electricity planning has kicked off in the Sudbury/Algoma electrical region to ensure a reliable supply of electricity and support local growth and economic development. Regional planning looks at the unique needs of each region and considers wire and non-wire options and innovative resources to meet the needs.

The Sudbury/Algoma region generally encompasses the District of Algoma including the City of Elliot Lake, the Municipality of Huron Shores, the Towns of Blind River and Spanish, and the Township of the North Shore. The District of Manitoulin including Municipalities of Central Manitoulin and Gordon/Barrie Island, the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin & Islands and the Townships of Assiginack, Billings, Burpee and Mills, Cockburn Island and Tehkummah. The Municipality of West Nipissing in the District of Nipissing, the City of Greater Sudbury and the District of Sudbury including the Municipalities of French River, Killarney, Markstay – Warren, St. Charles, the Town of Espanola, and the Townships of Baldwin, Nairn and Hyman, and Sables-Spanish Rivers.

As a first step, the IESO-led regional planning process involves determining the most appropriate planning approach going forward to meet electricity needs through a scoping assessment. Based on the information currently available, the draft recommendation is to proceed with developing an Integrated Regional Resource Plan (IRRP) for this region.

The IESO is hosting a webinar on December 18th, 2025 at 10 a.m. to provide an overview of the electricity planning process and seek input on the draft Scoping Assessment Outcome Report.
