The Town is also expecting to expand its Sewage Treatment Facility in the next 5-7 years, which could increase its electrical demand by 30-40%. Sufficient electrical capacity will be required to meet housing and servicing demands.
	The greenhouse sector is anticipating 4,000 additional acres in the Leamington and Kingsville area by 2030. In addition to the direct electrical requirements, IESO should consider the electrical demands of the support industries for this sector. For example, the Union Water Treatment Plant is currently undergoing expansion plans increase water treatment capacity.
What local issues and concerns should be considered in the electricity planning?	The Town of Kingsville currently experiences an unacceptable amount of electrical service disruptions, both in terms of frequency and duration. We understand this could be improved with an additional transmission line to our community. This infrastructure is critical to the future economic growth and sustainability of our municipality.
