EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury (BWG) respectfully submits this response to emphasize theoritical and immediate needor IESO to prioritize energy infrastructure solutions in our municipality. As a designated high-growth employment area experiencing severe hydro capacity constraints, BWG requires expedited action to unlock significant economic development opportunities that align with provincial growth objectives and major infrastructure investments.

URGENT NEED FOR IMMEDIATE ACTION

Critical Employment Area Under Constraint

BWG represents one of Ontario's most significant employment growth areas, with projections todouble our population and add 31,000 jobs by 2051. Our extensive provincially designated employment lands and substantial industrial, commercial, and institutional (ICI) designations are currently constrained by inadequate energy infrastructure, preventing us from realizing our full economic potential and supporting provincial growth targets.

The energy constraints in BWG are not just a local issue – they represent a significant impediment to provincial economic development and job creation goals.

Immediate Economic Impacts

Current energy limitations have already resulted in:

 Multiple multinational companies withdrawing investment plansdue to prohibitive hydro connection costs

CRITICAL BWG INITIATIVES DEPENDENT ON ENERGY SOLUTIONS

BWG has severalime-sensitive strategic initiativeshat cannot proceedeffectively without resolution of our energy infrastructure challenges:

1. Growth Management Study and Housing Pledge

Our comprehensive growth management study requires certainty around energy infrastructure capacity to properly plan for projected population and employment growth through 2051. Meeting our provincial housing pledge of 6,500 housing units by 2031 requires coordinated infrastructure planning, with energy capacity as a fundamental requirement.

2.Industrial Land Strategy

Development of our industrial land strategy is directly dependent on understanding energy capacity and upgrade timelines for our designated employment areas.

3. Community Improvement Plans

Implementation of Community Improvement Plans to incentivize industrial development cannot proceed without confidence in energy infrastructure capacity and reliability.

ALIGNMENT WITH MAJOR PROVINCIAL INVESTMENTS

BWG's energy infrastructure needs are directly connected to major provincial transportation investments that require immediate coordination:

Bradford Bypass Project

TheBradford Bypass, a significant provincial infrastructure investment, will dramatically increase BWG's accessibility and attractiveness for industrial and commercial development. This project is currently underway with completion of significant portions by 2029. Energy infrastructure upgrades must be coordinated with this timeline maximize the economic benefits of this provincial investment.

Metrolinx Projects

Ongoing Metrolinx projects in our south-Simcoe region and northern York Region will further enhance connectivity and development potential. Energy infrastructure planning must align with these transportation investments to ensure coordinated regional development.

These major provincial investments will be significantly underutilized if energy infrastructure constraints are not addressed concurrently.

SPECIFIC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMMEDIATE ACTION

1.Expedited IESO Planning and Assessment

- Prioritize BWG within the Integrated Energy Resource Planas a critical employment growth area
- Accelerate study timelinesto align with BWG's growth pressures and provincial infrastructure investments
- Provide interim solutionsto bridge gaps while larger infrastructure upgrades are implemented

2. Transmission Infrastructure Solutions

Based on IESO's June 2025 presentation identifying transmissionas the best option for our area:

- Fast-track planning for new transmission corridorbetween King and Vaughan
- Coordinate Markham transmission station timelinewith BWG development needs
- Prioritize northern route upgrades support BWG and broader northern York Region growth

3. York Energy Centre Transition Planning

With the York Energy Centre contract expiring in 2035 and the identified 400 MW shortfall:

- Develop immediate contingency plansfor energy supply to BWG
- Integrate Small Modular Reactor (SMR) planningat Darlington with northern distribution needs

• Ensure BWG energy needs are addressed before 2035rather thanafter YEC closure

4. Collaborative Implementation Framework

- Establish regular BWG-IESO-Hydro One coordination meetingsto align infrastructure planning with municipal growth strategies
- Create integrated planning protocolsthat coordinate energy infrastructure with transportation and housing development
- Develop cost-sharing frameworksto acceleratecritical infrastructure investments

ECONOMIC AND STRATEGIC IMPORTANCE

BWG's energy infrastructure challenges represent asignificant missed opportunity for Ontario:

- 31,000 projected new jobscannot be realized without adequate energy infrastructure
- Major industrial developments are already being delayed or lost to other jurisdictions
- Provincial transportation investments(Bradford Bypass, Metrolinx projects) will not achieve their full economic potential
- Housing and growth targetscannot be met without coordinated infrastructure planning

CONCLUSION AND CALL TO ACTION

The Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury respectfully requests that IESOtreat our energy infrastructure needs as an urgent provincial priority. The convergence of major provincial transportation investments, significant employment growth potential, and current energy constraints creates aunique window of opportunity that requires immediate action.

We cannot afford to wait until 2035 or beyond for solutions. BWG's strategic initiatives – Growth Management Study, Industrial Land Strategy, Community Improvement Plans, Housing Pledge commitment, and provincial Growth Target achievement – all depend on certainty and progress on energy infrastructure improvements.
