

TSF Registry FAQ August 2025

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Is there a preferred format for submitting application exhibits?

We remain flexible regarding the application format and have no preference whether all exhibits are submitted as a single document (excluding Exhibit A – Workbook) or uploaded as separate documents. Please ensure all exhibits are clearly named and easily identifiable.

2. Is there a target date for closing this Registry window and how much notice will IESO provide before closing the window? And where will it be posted?

To be eligible to submit a proposal for the competitive RFP, an applicant must be listed on the TSF Registry (a “Registrant”), be a Person Controlled by the Registrant, or be another Person whereby the Registrant holds at least 45% of its Economic Interest.

The TSF Registry opened in late July and at this time the IESO has not set a target date for closing the first Registry window, however, the window will close prior to the opening of the RFP submission period. The IESO strongly encourages transmitters to apply and register early.

To support early registration during the first Registry window, we are extending the renewal period by setting the two-year renewal start date to the window’s closing date. For example, if an entity registered in September 2025 and the window closes on January 1, 2027, the renewal date would be January 1, 2029—granting an additional 15 months of Registry status. More information on the Registration Renewal process can be found in Section 2.4 of the Registry Rules.

The IESO will post a notice on its website indicating when it intends to stop accepting Registry submissions. While a minimum notice period has not yet been defined, we currently anticipate providing 3 to 6 months notice. This notice period will coincide with the design, development, and engagement activities related to the RFP.
